## THE ETF CLAIMS A SOCIAL DIMENSION INSIDE OF THE SINGLE EUROPEAN SKY

fter almost 10 years of Single European Sky (SES) and despite the successful improvements with regard to safety, capacity, delays, efficiency and cost-reduction, the European Commission continues to describe the ATM system in Europe as being far too expensive, inefficient, over fragmented and based on outdated technical systems.

The Commission's description is clearly NOT reflecting the reality.

It embodies an unacceptable attack on the service providers, ATCOs and all ATM workers. The ATM industry is a service of general interest with public obligations for the Member States. The Commission is putting the stability in the sector at risk by introducing competition, liberalisation and more and more market principles.


In the course of next summer, the Commission intends to propose a new package based on its dogmatic approach.

- Yes to making the "human factor pillar" in the legislation as binding as the other 4 pillars
